Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. ...

... For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Matthew 13:31-34, 44-46, 51-53

Jesus put before them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches.' He told them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened.' Jesus told the crowds all these things in parables; without a parable he told them nothing. ...


'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.' ...

'Have you understood all this?' They answered, 'Yes.' And he said to them, 'Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.' When Jesus had finished these parables, he left that place.

REFLECTION

Jesus tells some funny stories. In recent weeks we've heard stories about a careless farmer randomly sowing seed and another story about weeds disrupting the growth of a farmer's crop and what to do about it. This week there are further stories drawn from everyday life about a mustard seed and about yeast, and later about treasures.

For us, mustard is something we buy in the condiments aisle of the supermarket and yeast comes in small foil sachets ready to be added to what we are baking. It was quite different back in Jesus' day. While the mustard seed was famously small, it was an unusual choice to plant in one's field. It grew more like a large weed, reaching perhaps 1.5 or 2 metres tall, scarcely a tree. But



the point is that Jesus' mission to establish the kingdom of God, while small and easily overlooked, would nevertheless seed a large and growing community of people that would eventually turn the world upside down (Acts 17:6). Likewise a small amount of leaven – more akin to a sourdough starter culture – could transform a huge batch of dough. If Jesus had been speaking these parables today perhaps he would have told a story about a tiny but contagious virus that started in a single place but grew to infect and disrupt the whole world ... so it is with the kingdom of God.

Then there is talk of treasure ... treasure hidden in a field (one form of first century banking ... see the later parable about hiding a talent in the ground in Matt 25:18) and treasure found by someone looking for it in the form of a beautiful pearl. And finally Jesus speaking of treasures new and old. The kingdom of God is like the treasure – so valuable that it's worth selling everything one has to obtain it – something old but also fresh and new in the words of Jesus.



Elsewhere Jesus warns about earthly treasures that rust and decay, urging people to store up treasure in heaven (Matt 6:19-21). What do we most treasure? What could we not bear to lose? Where does Jesus' message about the kingdom rate in our lived priorities?

In these challenging times that we are living through, our thoughts are easily distracted and disturbed by daily briefings about coronavirus numbers and its spread. Where is peace to be found? How are we even to begin to pray when we feel anxious or fearful? The wisdom in Paul's letter to the Romans is that God's own Spirit intercedes for us in sighs or groans too deep for words. We may not be able to see now how all things are working together for good, but the Spirit knows our hearts and also knows the will of God, which is to bring abundant life and light into our lives.

Despite our worries, Paul today would assure us that not even the threat of coronavirus can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ. Let us hold firmly onto this hope, for this is what can help bring peace to our hearts in the midst of these dark and troubling days.
